Golda Meir always acted on her strong feelings to do the right thing—no matter what the price. Meet “Goldie Meyerson” in her formative years, 1914-1948, just after the time she lived in Denver. Witness her strong will and call to action from rebellious teenager, to kibbutz pioneer, to mother and wife, to dedicated contributor, to the creation of the State of Israel. Golda Meir’s hope and vision for the Jewish people—to exist as a sovereign state and to live in peace with their Arab neighbors—is as vital today as it was in 1948.

The 40-minute monologue will be followed with a 10-minute Q&A as Mrs. Meyerson, finishing with a 10-minute Q&A with the scholar/ presenter.
